Real Life, Real World

Last month, the Southampton Circle held a garden party which raised £530, alongside two bursary awards totalling £300, to support two CathSoc students from Southampton University to spend their summer at the migrant camps in Reggio, Italy. Julie-Anne Ntege is 20 years, of Ugandan descent, born and raised in London. 21 year old Amanda Silva comes from Brazil and has lived in London for the past nine years. Both girls were accompanied by Sr. Valentina, Chaplain of Southampton University and a native of Reggio. As the trio embarked on their travels, they shared their thoughts through their blog and Julie-Anne's entry revealed that while she expected to face desperation and extreme circumstances, she also hoped to find that God's love would nevertheless prevail.



For Amanda, the first day in Reggio proved beyond expectation as the trio were exposed to the realities of the workers, volunteers and refugees. It made her realise the importance of following Jesus in her journey. From that first day, the girls experienced at first hand the most inspirational stories of courage. Julie-Anne shared a very personal exchange with a 27 year old Nigerian woman who could not understand why someone from her part of the world had volunteered. Julie-Anne's Ugandan background was also the reason why Sr. Valentina suggested that she stayed the night at the hospital with a traumatised 15 year old

Nigerian girl, an experience that Julie-Anne described as one of the most difficult of her life so far.



All three were personally affected by the arrival of around 700 people to the emergency camps. Sr. Valentina worked alongside Medecins Sans Frontieres as a translator while Amanda and Julie-Anne distributed food, drink and footwear. They have been inspired by the many volunteers they have met and who have taught them vital lessons in both everyday and spiritual life. Some of these volunteers are parents who travel with their children to many war zones and one such family stayed with the trio during part of their stay.



For Valentina, Amanda and Julie-Anne, they say that they are yet to conclude how their perspectives have changed by their own volunteer work. But that they leave Reggio greatly changed is in no doubt and that they do so with a deeper understanding of what it means to be a refugee.
