## CIRCLE PROFILE: GRAHAM PALETHORPE CELEBRATES 25 YEARS!



*Bro. Vice President, Graham Palethorpe celebrated 25 years as a Catenian brother this August which provided a good excuse to feature our future Circle President in a Circle profile! Here, Graham speaks openly about his appreciation for the Association and talks about the campaign, *Our Parish's Future*, in which he plays a role.*

Graham Palethorpe was quietly minding his own business in church one Sunday when he was approached by a dapper gentlemen, a retired RAF Wing Commander called Lawrence Crawley, who invited Graham to be a guest at a Catenian meeting. Never one to pass an opportunity of a free dinner, Graham accepted although he mistakenly thought it would be a prayer group similar to the Knights. At that time the Catenian Association was unknown to the Palethorpe family, even to Graham's devout mother-in-law, so those first three dinners were quite enlightening. He joined the Southampton Circle alongside a good friend and thus began a relationship which has endured.

Over the years, Graham has held the office of President and Provincial Officer. He was President in 2000, the year of the Circle's 100th meeting, and so it is rather surprising, and perhaps rare, that this is the first time that he has been a Vice President! Graham had expected to hold that office in 2000 but when the forthcoming President had to suddenly resign because of family issues, Graham was suddenly elevated to the position of President minus a year's apprenticeship as VP. He credits Philip Crook and Joe Gleeson for guiding him through that incredible year. He says that they wound him up, pointed him in the right direction and off he went! He and Chris had so much fun, meeting so many lovely people from the other Circles and he also enjoyed presiding over the monthly meetings. It was the best decision he had ever made - apart from marrying Chris of course!

Graham feels that the Association opens up opportunities to make contact with people of such varied and interesting backgrounds that members may not meet in their own social circles. As an example, Graham cites a dinner over 20 years ago when he was seated next to a gentlemen who spoke little throughout the meal. It was only towards the end of the evening when Graham learned that his dining companion flew Hurricanes during WWII and he was greatly affected by the fact that he had been in the presence of someone who had risked his life to put an end to tyranny and terror. Quietly and softly spoken, this man was a giant and a hero among his fellow diners and yet where else would Graham have met him? Certainly not among his and Chris's own circle of friends.

Graham is a Hampshire native who was born in New Milton. His father was a policeman with postings in Petersfield and Ringwood until he finally moved the family to Southampton when Graham was 18 years old. His wife, Christine, is a Southampton lass who schooled at St. Anne's. Their son, David, is a recently qualified junior doctor at St. George's, Tooting and their daughter, Catherine, is a King's University graduate in Spanish who is working for a London talent and literary agency. Graham has spent much of his career at IBM but latterly has been employed by the Diocese of Portsmouth to work on *Our Parish's Future* project, formerly known as *Faith in Action*. A parish centric campaign with funds going directly to the parishes, Graham says that *Our Parish's Future* gives parishioners the opportunity to consider carefully about the future needs of their parish against a backdrop of ever-increasing maintenance costs. Significant running costs will arise in the near future and financial challenges must be faced. Each parish must nurture and strengthen its relationship with Christ, sharing and celebrating the Good News in homes, work places and communities. The New Evangelisation will encompass many programmes that will also need funding. As Pope Francis has stated: "Mere administration can no longer be enough. Throughout the world, let us be permanently in a state of mission."

Over the past 25 years as a Catenian brother, Graham has come to understand the significance of the Association's name and symbol. As each Circle is a link in a big chain, he envisages a big anchor welded to the end of that chain, securing each and every member to a set of beliefs and moral values. Catenian brothers are continually reminded of life's challenges through work, social media and other external sources and it is comforting to be able to rely on the fortitude and solidarity of their fellow Brothers who are also facing their own trials but are still willing to offer guidance, support and prayer on each other's behalf. It is something that he and Chris personally experienced this year through the loss of Chris's mother, Margaret, when the love and prayers offered across the Province provided great comfort. As many of the Southampton Circle know, Graham and Chris are so very generous in proffering their own support to others. When April 2015 arrives and Graham takes over from Bro. President Peter Clapham, the Southampton Circle can be assured of continued excellent leadership and the strengthening of the beliefs and values that have sustained the Catenian Association through to modern times.

It was with great sorrow that the Southampton Circle learned of the death last week of Fr. George Lyons. Fr. George was the Priest at St. Joseph's, Romsey and St. Andrew's, North Baddesley, for ten years until last September and was well-known to many of the Southampton Circle Brothers and wives. On Bank Holiday Monday he had travelled with the Vicar General, Fr. Michael Dennehy, to his home town of Killenaule, Co. Tipperary, to visit his 93 year old mother. Fr. Michael writes: "We celebrated Mass on Tuesday morning at the nursing home where she [Mrs Lyons] resides and the three of us had lunch in a town nearby. That evening we met an old friend who is now Parish Priest of Fr. George's home parish. He went to bed that night and I found that he had slipped away during the night when I called him in the morning." Fr. Michael reminds us about Fr. George's capacity to speak to peoples' hearts and his ability to empathise with parishioners in their suffering and, with Bishop Philip, he asks us to remember Fr. George, his mother and family in our prayers. May he rest in God's peace.
