EXTRACTS FROM THE ARCHIVES

Council meeting, 9 October 1973 at the Berkeley Hotel

"B. Stowe had seen Bro. Francis, Headmaster of St Mary's College, whose school was continuing with Prize Giving Day, and consequently he would be very glad to accept the £4.00 Catenian donation for his school. Neither St Anne's nor St George's were having Prize Days and consequently some discussion took place as to whether the Circle should continue to donate an annual sum, to be used for some other purpose. Peter O'Connor felt that as their original attached to these prizes was no longer valid, the idea of making the annual donation should be dropped. On the other hand C. Davidovitz felt just as strongly that they should be continued, even if used for some other school purpose, such as a reward for diligence in carrying out an assigned project. Eventually it was decided by 5 to 4 to refer this whole matter back to Circle for discussion. Council itself was 5 to 4 in favour of discontinuing the annual donation." (Ed.note: £4 in 1973 is around £45 now)
